SIXTH FORM UNIFORM

All boys are required to wear a dark suit or navy blue blazer and dark grey trousers. Shirts may be white or of any pastel shade. They must not be black or purple. Plain black leather shoes of standard pattern and the sixth form tie (which will be supplied at the sixth form induction meeting on Monday 6 September 2010) must be worn. Pullovers must be plain grey or dark blue and V-necked; socks must be grey or of a dark colour. It is important that all boys in the sixth form recognise the need for conformity to avoid the possibility of being asked to go home and change into the official uniform.

Hair is to be worn at a reasonable length, at the discretion of the Headmaster, and it is to be kept tidily trimmed. Hair should retain its natural colour. Facial hair (beard, moustache) is not allowed unless specific permission has been sought in advance from the Headmaster. Side burns should be trimmed to a reasonable length. No jewellery may be worn.
