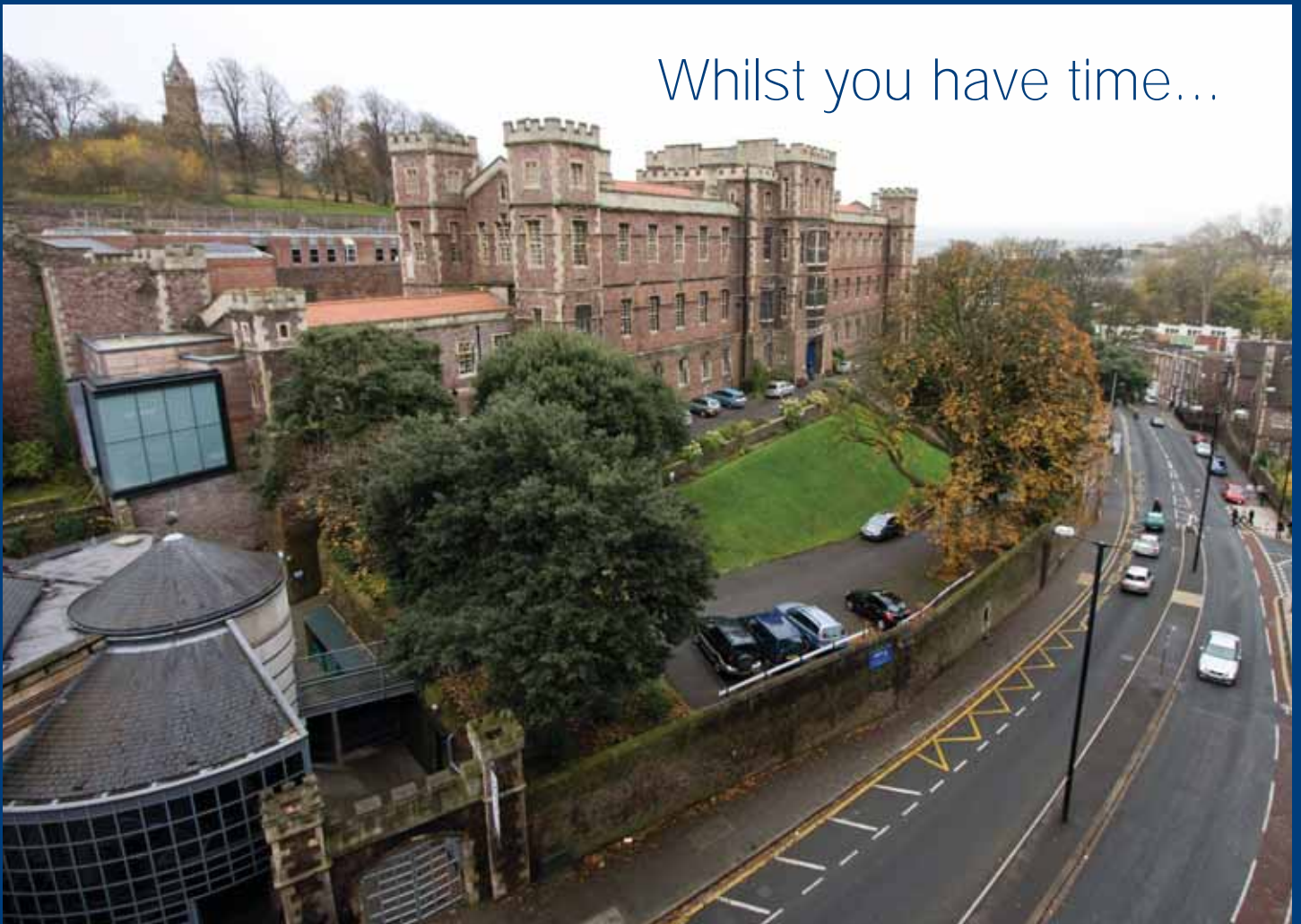


Whilst you have time...

A tradition of financial assistance

QEH has a long tradition of benefactions. We owe our existence to the gift left by John Carr in his Will in 1586. Subsequently the School has received numerous further gifts.

These gifts have been used to make the School what it is today - that is to offer the best value for money, in terms of independent education in the City. A school that performs well in the League Tables and prepares boys for University life.

The School has changed with the arrival of junior boys but some things never change, especially the need to secure additional funding. We currently support about 10% of the boys at QEH financially. We aim, with your help, to be able to support even more.





How you could make a difference

On leaving QEH current pupils are presented with this challenge inscribed in their Leavers' Bible.

"I Charge you never to forget the great benefits that you have received in this place, and in time to come, according to your means, to do all that you can to enable others to enjoy the same advantage; and to remember that you carry with you, wherever you go, the good name of Queen Elizabeth's Hospital".

In Autumn 2006 we launched our Development Campaign explaining what makes QEH special, what was needed to secure the future of our bursaries and how you might be able to help us. Our Fundraising Appeal has received many generous donations already. To all who have given we are immensely grateful but we still need to raise more funds.

A gift in your Will could be used to support deserving boys and to fund our future capital projects.

Ways of giving

If you are in the process of making a Will and need to provide your solicitor with the wording please ask for assistance. The QEH Development Officer will be happy to provide you with this as well as information on how such gifts are free from Inheritance Tax and Capital Gains Tax.

Gifts can be left through a Pecuniary Legacy (a specified sum), a Residuary Legacy (a percentage of an estate after specific bequests have been made) or a Gift In Kind (for example shares, property of other gifts).



1586 SOCIETY

The 1586 Society, which honours John Carr's bequest, has been created for those who leave legacies and other generous donors. It exists for the purpose of recognising those who have considered the School's financial future.

The Society hosts events to which you and your partners will be invited, including events hosted by the Headmaster.

Membership to the Society is confidential and is only known to those at School directly involved in Fundraising or on the governing body.



SIX CENTURIES OF GIVING

Just a few examples of historic gifts:

- 1586** John Carr: In his Will bequeathed, "The Manor of Congresbury and lands and tenements in Bristol to found an Hospital in the City of Bristol".
- 1589** William Bird: £530, "To the founding of Queen Elizabeth's Hospital".
- 1601** Lady Mary Ramsey: £1,000 to invest in property at Winterbourne.
- 1716** Samuel Hartnell: £700 to purchase land sufficient to maintain 3 boys.
- 1808** Samuel Gist (Old Boy): Money from his plantations in Virginia to pay for 3 boys.
- 1924** Melville Wills (School Governor): The Eastfield Road playing fields.
- 1990** 400th Anniversary Appeal: £250,000 towards the QEH Theatre.
- 2003** Gerald James Ball (Old Boy): £20,000.
- 2010** Bertram W Vowles (Old Boy): £20,000
- 2011** Leonard H Palmer (Old Boy): £20,000
