Year 9

The core curriculum contains: mathematics, English, physics, chemistry, biology, geography, history, religion & philosophy, the Enrichment programme and physical education. Four other subjects are chosen from French, German, Spanish, Latin, Greek, art, drama, DT, information technology and music. At least one modern foreign language must be chosen.

The GCSE Years

In Years 10 and 11 the core curriculum contains: mathematics, English (Language and Literature), the Enrichment programme (Year 10), PSHE (Year 11). The Enrichment programme and PSHE are not examined. Seven more GCSE subjects are chosen (in consultation with parents) from:

The timetable is constructed to give as many pupils as possible their first choices. Unless there are good reasons, all pupils take ten GCSE subjects as a minimum. At least two sciences and one modern foreign language must be chosen.

Sets and Class Sizes

Mathematics and Spanish are setted according to ability from Year 7. English is setted from Year 10. Class sizes in Years 7 and 8 vary, with some classes taught in half-classes.

FINANCIAL INFORMATION

Fees

From September 2021, until further notice, the fees will be:

£40 (non refundable)

Senior School

Tuition fee

£15,300 per year (payable at the start of each term in three instalments of £5,100) including compulsory Accident Insurance, textbooks and essential educational trips. Excludes public examination charges.

Lunch charge

£236 per term (chargeable in termly instalments). The lunch charge is compulsory for pupils in Years 3-11.

Breakfast charge

Charged on a per item basis. Available between 7.40am and 8 20am

There is a sibling discount of 5% for a second or subsequent sibling whilst the older sibling is still at QEH.

Point of entry

Our standard points of entry are Year 7 and Year 12 (for our co-educational Sixth Form). Occasional spaces may arise in other year groups. Please contact Admissions for more information.

Scholarships & Bursaries

Queen Elizabeth's Hospital was founded in 1586 through the generosity of John Carr, a wealthy Bristol merchant. When it first opened in 1590 with a Charter from Queen Elizabeth I, the School was specifically charged with 'the education of poor children and orphans'.

QEH continues to give a first-class education for children, offering substantial financial assistance to those who genuinely need it, in the spirit of the original Royal Charter.

Scholarships

Every candidate who sits the Entrance Examination is entered for an academic scholarship which recognises the potential contribution to school life made by pupils of exceptional academic ability.

Music and sports scholarships are also available, for which a specific application must be made.

Sixth Form scholarships are available for boys and girls of exceptional talent. A specific application must be made for a scholarship offered in the following areas: Maths, Science, IT, Languages (Ancient and Modern). Literature, Arts and Social Sciences, Sport, Drama, Art and Music.

Bursaries

Bursaries are means-tested and occasionally a pupil may receive up to 100% assistance towards fees, on a sliding scale, depending on a family's gross income. As a guideline, where joint parental income is below £70,000 per annum their child is likely to qualify for assistance. It is possible for a pupil to receive both a bursary and a scholarship. Some means tested bursaries will be available at Sixth Form.

Subject to their performance in the Entrance Examination, QEH offers bursaries to provide financial assistance to any child who would benefit from a QEH education but could not otherwise afford to attend the School.

A bursary stays with a pupil throughout their time in the School but may change in value if the parents' income alters.





Assessment & Application for a Scholarship or Bursary

Academic Scholarships

Every candidate who sits the Entrance Examination is automatically entered for an academic scholarship. There is no further application to complete.

Academic scholars must have shown exceptional achievement in the Entrance Examination where they are assessed on their performance in English, Mathematics and Verbal Reasoning tests.

The award is not means-tested and will remain with the pupil throughout their time at the School (subject to the conditions of the scholarship).

They will be expected to continue to contribute with enthusiasm to the academic life of the School.

Music Scholarships

Applicants for awards must demonstrate exceptional ability in music, in addition to demonstrating sound academic performance in the Entrance Examination.

We seek all-round musical talent and potential (not just grades achieved) though, as a rough guide, we would expect applicants to be at minimum, Grade III standard (for Year 7).

Holders of music awards will be required to learn two instruments and to take music as a GCSE subject.

Music applicants will be shortlisted and those of appropriate standard invited for an interview and audition by the Director of Music. They will be requested to perform a piece of their choice on their first and second instrument (or voice), a sight reading test and aural test.



Successful candidates will also be expected to contribute fully to the musical life of the School. It is our hope that the award will continue throughout a pupil's School career.

Sports Scholarships

Applicants for awards must demonstrate exceptional ability in sport, in addition to demonstrating sound academic performance in the Entrance Examination.

We look for the best all-round sportsman assessed at the time of the Entrance Examination.

Sports applicants will be shortlisted and invited for an interview and assessment by the Director of Sport. Assessments will take the form of an interview and practical tasks. Awards will be made to the best all-round candidate who will be able to demonstrate high levels of skill and achievement in at least two of the main school sports. We expect candidates to have a 'preferred' sport.

The Sports scholar will be expected to represent the School regularly, and show a commitment to attend and participate in sporting events and the wider sporting life of their House and the School.

External sports opportunities may sometimes compromise a scholar's availability to play for the School but we will still expect him to represent the School when not required for a more important (and previously agreed) non-School commitment. The scholarship will be reviewed annually, though it is our hope and expectation that the award will continue throughout a pupil's School career.

If you wish to apply for a Bursary, your application must be received by the School before your child sits the Entrance Examination. Please indicate that you are applying for an Assisted Place on the application form and return the Statement of Financial Circumstances form (included in the application pack) to the Bursar's office as early as possible.

Bursaries are also available at Sixth Form entry.





Gifted & Talented Programme

All John Carr Scholars are recognized under the School's 'Gifted & Talented' 3-Tier approach, co-ordinated by the Scholarship Programme Director. Because QEH is selective, we include in the programme a large number of able pupils not in receipt of a scholarship.

Two thirds of our pupils qualify as 'gifted learners' in national terms. Although we have our own 'Gifted & Talented' programme for the most able, no pupil feels singled out and we ensure that everyone's talent is nurtured through enrichment and extension activities which offer excitement and challenge in their learning. Equally, the School works with parents to agree the extent of extra provision so that a child is never over-burdened.

There are three main points of entry though places in other Years occasionally become available:

At Year 7 (11-plus)

Candidates must complete an 11-plus application form to sit the Entrance Examinations. Papers are in Verbal Reasoning with additional Mathematics and English papers. There is also an interview. (Please note: Entry at 11-plus is also open to exceptionally able pupils who are younger (10-plus) if it is felt that they are able to work with older pupils throughout their secondary education).

Entrance Examinations for Year 7: Saturday 15 and 22 January 2022 for entry the following September.


Sixth Form

Candidates must complete a Sixth Form application form. The minimum grades we accept are at least 6 GCSEs at grade 6, with a grade 7 in subjects you're planning to study at A-level. However, due to high demand for places, it is likely that offers made to external candidates will be higher. Please see our Sixth Form prospectus for more details.

Special Educational Needs

Those with Special Educational Needs must submit an up-to-date report from a certified Educational Psychologist before the examination. Extra time may be allowed in the examination in consultation with the Head of Learning Support, and on the basis of the report. It is also important that we are informed, before the examination, of any other circumstances which might necessitate extra time in the examination or special arrangements if your child joins the School. The granting of extra time is at the discretion of the School.

HOW TO FIND QEH



Bristol Centre & QEH

By road: Follow signs to Clifton, where you will find QEH. QEH is easily accessible from both the M4 and M5 motorways.

By train: Railway stations are at Bristol Parkway (not marked) or Temple Meads.

From Temple Meads it is possible to catch the No. 8 or No. 9 bus to Clifton Triangle (about 20 minutes) from the stop at the approach ramp to the station. Alternatively, it is possible to take the No.1 bus from outside 'The Reckless Engineer' public house across the road from the station entrance.



QEH Sports Ground

From outside Bristol – use M5 Motorway to Jct. 19 – then follow the A369 towards Bristol for approx 4km to B3129 Beggar Bush Lane. Turn right and follow road for 3km to traffic lights. Turn left and Sports Ground is 200m ahead on the right hand side – opposite the Bristol Cricket Club ground.

From Bristol - use A370 Westonsuper-Mare road and leave via B3125 signed to Failand and Clevedon. The Sports Ground is 3km ahead on the left hand side, past the Long Ashton Golf Course.
